Pupil Premium Report September 2022

All schools receive additional income called the Pupil Premium (PP). This money is allocated by the Government to help schools support children from low income families and children in care. The amount of additional funding schools receive is based on the number of children who are entitled to receive free school meals in the last 6 years or who are looked after children.

Nationally, PP pupils make less progress when compared to other students. For example, there is a large gap in the attainment of PP and non-PP in terms of progress 8 scores. Pupil Premium money has been given to help schools close the gap.

Our pupil premium students like other students were affected by the pandemic in Years 9 and 10 which meant their overall achievement was less than the non-pupil premium students as shown on the table below;

We continue to monitor the progress of all our students throughout their school life, and track specific students including students identified as PP carefully to ensure that intervention support and challenge is provided to those who need it.

Quality support is given to our PP students to ensure that they are enabled to achieve outcomes which reflect their ability. PP students are well supported in the run up to examinations and have good attendance for all exams.
