He has published a book on his best chess games, a copy of which is in the school library.

It was a most enjoyable experience for all concerned, including Philip himself, who writes: "After playing for Barbados at the 45th Chess Olympiad in Budapest, Hungary, it was my personal pleasure and privilege to stage my second simultaneous display at the school, the first having been nearly seven years ago. The standout game for me was a hard-fought contest against Minos (12.2). My thanks to the school and to Alan for making this possible, and I trust that the evident ongoing growth in numbers and playing strength of the Hendon Chess Club will continue!"

The students answered 25 multiple choice questions which were designed to stimulate problem solving skills and to be very challenging for even our elite mathematicians.

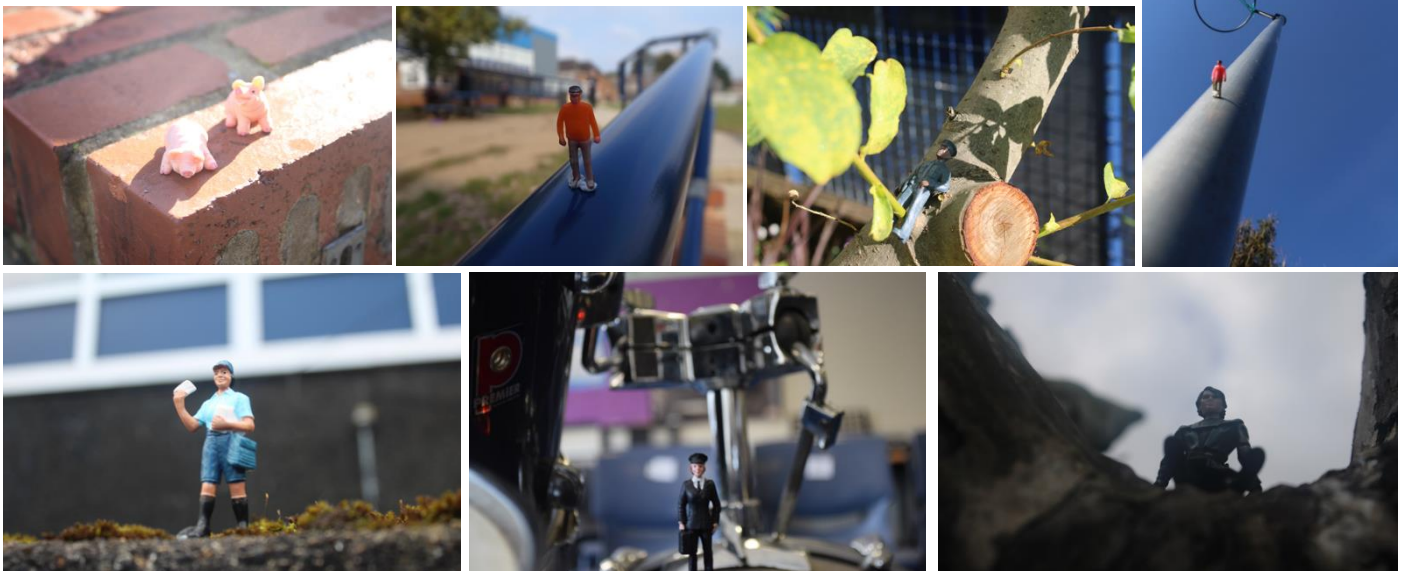

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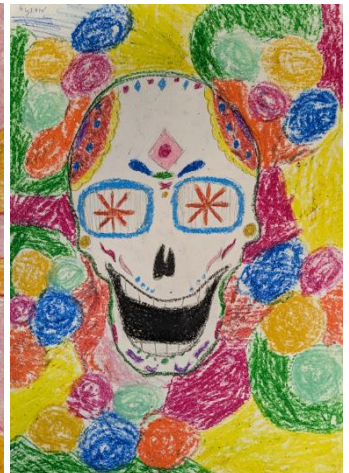
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## Year 9 Day of the Dead drawings

### DENNIS MORRIS



Dennis Morris started his career at an early age. He was 11 years old when one of his photographs was printed on the front page of the Daily Mirror. A camera fanatic since the age of 8, Dennis was known around his East End neighbourhood as Mad Dennis, due to his preference for photography over football. After inadvertently stumbling across a particularly feisty demonstration by the PLO one Sunday, the sharp young Dennis took his film to a photo agency on Fleet Street who promptly sold it to the Daily Mirror for £16.

It was Dennis's photos of Marley that caught the eye of the young Johnny Rotten. Rotten, a massive reggae fan, had long admired Dennis's work and requested that he take the first official shots of the Sex Pistols upon signing to Virgin Records. Still in his teens, Dennis was the same age as the Pistols and they soon learned to trust him completely, allowing him unrestricted access to their strange and chaotic existence.



### Tyrone Williams




I like Tyrone Williams because his work feels thoughtful and artistic, using photography in a way that makes you think.

### Nadine Ijewere



Nadine Ijewere is a London-born photographer of Nigerian-Jamaican parentage. She works in the fields of fashion and portraiture, and is known for celebrating the diversity of her models, many of whom do not conform to the standard fashion industry stereotypes.

At age 26, Ijewere became the first woman of colour to shoot a cover for *VOGUE*, anywhere in the world.

Leaving university, she went straight into taking her own pictures, crediting social media with helping her to establish relationships with collaborators casting models from Instagram, and enabling her to gradually build her reputation. Ijewere shoots for numerous publications such as *WSJ* magazine, *British Vogue*, *Vogue US*, *Vogue Italia*, *Luncheon*, *More or Less*. Her January 2019 cover story with Dua Lipa, Binx Walton and Letitia Wright made Ijewere the first woman of colour to shoot the cover of one of *Vogue* edition in the magazine's 125-year history. She has also worked with Dior, Hermes, Stella McCartney, Nina Ricci and Valentino Red, creating still and film campaigns.

### Armet Francis



Armet Francis is a famous photographer who was born in 29 January 1945. He was born in Jamaica. Not only is he a photographer but also a publisher who lived in London since the 1950s.
