Book Clubs - Updates




Creative Writing Book

Through fun exercises, they cultivate original ideas to write micro fiction and short stories while also learning about narrative structure, character development, and the power of descriptive language.


Manga Book Club

 Coming Soon: Super Readable Book Club



Audiopi: audio study and revision guides for GCSE and A-Level.

National Literacy Trust: view the "Zone In" page for tips on boosting your reading, writing, speaking and listening skills. There are also new free eBooks every week, and challenges available to write your own video game story.

Oxford Owl: free parent account makes many eBooks, educational videos and games available for free.

Project Gutenberg: this website offers over 42.000 free eBooks.

Stan Lee Excelsior Award: a nationwide book award for graphic novels and mangas where kids aged 11-16 vote on the winning books.

The School Reading List: information on children's writing competitions and KS3 / KS4 reading lists.

Young Writer Awards: information on the National Writing Competitions.
